

Women's Housing Association



The Women's Housing Association provides safe and stable housing to women with or without children, who have endured domestic or family violence.



Their clients include women and their children seeking medium to long term housing, after escaping domestic or family violence. They are often women in crisis and in extremely difficult circumstances.

In July 2008, HomeStart approved a loan for the construction of a four bedroom house in Riverton, within the Clare and Gilbert Valleys Council. The dwelling was designed with two living areas, to house a large family or two families. This project was made possible with a state government grant and with land donated by the council.

In 2009, the Women's Housing Association set their sights on further expanding their affordable rental accommodation. With a State Government grant, a generous grant from the Wyatt Benevolent Institution and a loan from HomeStart, a further five homes have been built in Noarlunga. The homes will provide affordable accommodation to single older women.

The association now has over 320 houses within their portfolio; however with over 400 women and children on their waiting list (both in metropolitan and country areas) they aim to continue their growth.
